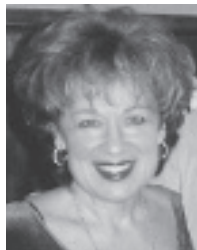


# Annual Report



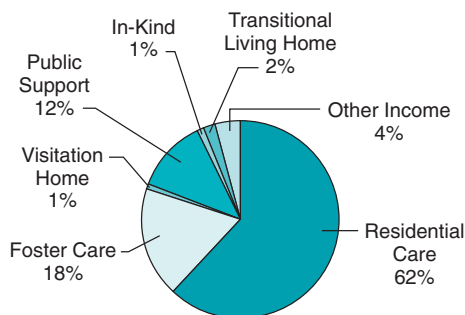
Our 20th year of operation was a huge success in all departments. We had an incredible Twentieth Anniversary Celebration Dinner on May 17. Over 500 friends, family, alumni residents, Board Members and staff attended as we looked back at our past, at our present and ahead to our future. Most importantly we have stayed true to our mission, *“To assist troubled young people and their families in rebuilding their lives through caring relationships and opportunities to grow mentally, physically, socially and spiritually.”*

We have been able to make progress towards our goals set for 2007 and forge ahead to 2008. All of our six programs continue to operate within the guidelines of their purposes and our Licenses to operate, provided by the State Department of Social Services. We have continued to receive clean financial audits and inspections of Community Care Licensing in all our programs. We have three Residential Group Homes for 32 boys ages 13 to 17 on our 80 Acre Ranch in rural Madera County. We have our Therapeutic Foster Family Agency, caring for 25 children in 13 foster homes in Fresno and Madera Counties. We have completed 10 adoption home studies for Fresno County Department of Children and Family Services this year. Our Bonding Home provides supervised visits for 20-30 children/week and the Transitional Living Home cares for 4 young men ages 18-24. This year there were a total of 6 young men who lived with us there. In total we have worked with over 140 new children and youth this year.

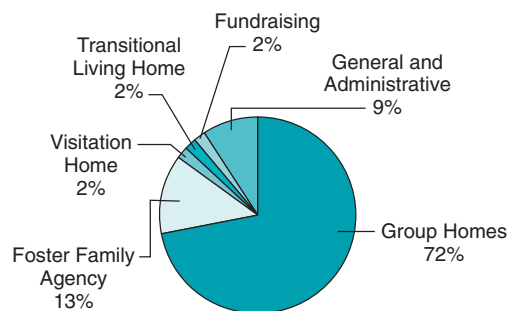
In our 20 year history there have been over 1600 children and youth admitted to all our programs. There has been a total of 350 full and part-time staff employed by our agency, including 60 each day. There have been 25 Board Members, 1000 volunteers and 5000 donors to our agency. Our Motto of “Building Young Lives” continues to ring true 24-7.

I hear from former residents of our Group Homes daily. They are working, married, having children and still praying for all of us, too. They also come back as volunteers to talk to the young boys about their choices in life both while they are living at the ranch and as they face their futures, too. The success of our programs often times is a long-term process. As our kids grow up they do remember all the things we taught them and start implementing it into their own lives, eventually!
